Camper Release Form

On the last day of their Session, Campers will only be released to the guardians and/or emergency contacts listed on their applications in Camp Doc (these can be updated online up to <u>14</u> days prior to Camp).

If someone other than those listed on the application will be picking up your child, please fill out this form and bring it with you to check-in. If pick-up plans change <u>during Camp</u>, you can send this completed form with the authorized adult to the docks. We will not release a camper to any unauthorized adults. All authorized adults must be 18 or older.

Photo ID is required for all persons picking up children.

Drop-Off Procedures

× ARRIVE EARLY

- 7:00am 12-17 year olds
- 7:30am 7-11 year olds
- × Bring COMPLETE FORMS from this mailer.

× STAY IN YOUR CAR until a Med Nurse comes by to check you in.

× Eat a good breakfast prior to arrival!

× Drive through our Check In Stations with caution and watch for pedestrians.

× We ask that your children keep all hands, arms, feet and legs inside the Catalin Express charter boats. We ask that nurses remain close to their assigned cabin(s) of kids.

Pick-Up Procedures

× Arrive by 1:30pm

- × Be patient boat arrival times may vary
- × Bring photo ID to sign out your child

** You can authorize another adult to pick up your camper with the **Camper Release Form** provided in this manual.

Please wait to look for your child's luggage until ALL bags have been unloaded from both boats! IF ANYTHING CHANGES WITH PICK-UP OR DROP-OFF, WE WILL EMIL AND TEXT CAMPER GUARDIANS.

Luggage and Packing Tips

Clothes will get dirty, so we recommend wearing clothes that aren't fancy and new! Please make sure your camper has luggage marked with their full name so it won't get lost in transit!

Pack light! Please limit your camper's luggage to one piece.

- A duffel bag that can also hold their sleeping bag and pillow is best.
- Mark all personal items with your child's full name.
- Prepare for beach weather: chilly in the am/pm, hot during the day.
- Leave anything at home if it is of value or would be missed if lost.
- We recommend having campers help pack their bags. They'll know where everything is and be able to repack at the end of camp.

Please DO NOT BRING:

- \cdot Cell phones
- \cdot iPads or other tablets
- \cdot Soda/Candy
- \cdot Alcohol
- · Valuables
- \cdot Personal sports equipment
- \cdot Animals
- \cdot Weapons (including pocket knives)
- · Drugs/Other illicit items
- · Tobacco products

Camp del Corazon is not responsible for any personal items.

Medication Information



All medication must be turned in at medical check-in.

All guardians must submit a Medication Release Form at check-in, even if your child is not currently on any medications.

Please follow these steps for sending medications to Camp:

- Provide only an 8-day supply of medications.
- Medications should be sent in their original prescription bottle, clearly labeled with the camper's name, medication name, and dosage.

Do not sort medications into daily doses.

- Over-the-counter medication (Tylenol, Advil, etc.), vitamins, and supplements must be included and listed with the camper's other medications.
- Send medication bottles in a large Ziploc bag with the camper's name clearly written on it.
- Medications requiring refrigeration should be placed in a separate bag with the camper's name and "Needs Refrigeration" written on it.
- Medications for the first day of camp should be placed in the envelopes provided and given to the nurses at check-in.
- Campers are not permitted to administer their own medications.

Our medical staff and Health Center are prepared to handle any cardiac-related issues—but they spend most of their time fixing up scraped knees and bee stings.

What if something more serious happens to my camper?

If the camp physician determines that additional medical treatment is required, we will contact you to arrange pick up of your child.

If the camp physician determines that advanced medical care is required, you will be contacted and local paramedics and/or the Los Angeles County Air Squad will be called. Your child will be accompanied by one of the camp physicians to an emergency facility.

FYI - The Medical team will conduct a surprise "Mock Code" while on the island to practice our emergency protocols. You may want to warn your child about this "Emergency Drill" - they might see it happen, but they have nothing to worry about!

Frequently Asked Questions

Who will be watching my camper?

Your child will be in a cabin with 5-8 other campers of their approximate age.

Every cabin has at least 2 staff members. Two cabin counselors spend all day, everyday with the cabin group.

There will be an RN (we call them "Med Nurses") assigned specifically to your camper's cabin to handle all medications and keep an eye on the health of the campers.

Can I call/visit my camper?

To maximize your child's acclimation to the Camp del Corazon experience, we do not allow phone access, cell phones, or parent visits to camp. If there is an emergency, you will be contacted immediately by our office. If you have an emergency, please call our office and we will relay the message to the island.



What if my camper gets homesick?

It happens!

Our amazing staff is trained to handle homesickness.

Camp Safety &

Communicable Disease

Prevention

In order to keep campers safe, we are doing a few important things to ensure that campers remain healthy at camp. Although some things are different, the fun remains!

1. Vaccinations

- Encouraged for all (staff and campers) but not required.
- Reach out to info@campdelcorazon.org with questions.

2. Masks

- Masking is not required but optional if someone wants to wear one, and may be required if someone is showing active signs of an illness.
- You may want to pack **7 masks** for your child's stay at camp. .

3. COVID Testing

- Rapid Tests conducted on everyone at the dock, and as needed due to exposure and symptoms on the island.
- \circ $\$ PCR testing encouraged but not required prior to camp.

4. Isolation

 \circ $\;$ Isolation area will be used for positive cases.

Again, our Protocols may change at any point due to the uncertain nature of COVID-19. In this case, we will let the community know via email when we get closer to camp. Thank you for adhering to our safety protocols!
